## **Australian Passports – Emergency Passport Applications**

In certain circumstances, we can issue you an emergency passport if you need to travel urgently and your existing passport has been stolen, damaged or lost.

**Emergency passports can take up to two working days to be issued.** We recommend waiting for the decision on whether an emergency passport can be issued before making firm travel plans or purchasing tickets.

Emergency passports have only four visa pages, no electronic chip, and are generally used to facilitate return travel to Australia.

### **Not returning to Australia?**

Some countries **do not** allow travellers to enter on emergency passports. You should check with the relevant embassy or consulate of the country you are travelling to confirm if they will accept an emergency passport.

An emergency passport is normally issued for 7 months as most countries that allow entry with an emergency passport require passports to have at least 6 months of validity remaining.

### **How to apply**

1. Please contact us on (076) 317 700 (follow the prompts for consular services) or email [consular.phuket@dfat.gov.au](mailto:consular.phuket@dfat.gov.au) to make a booking to lodge your emergency passport application.
2. Obtain a police report regarding the loss or theft of your passport.
3. Obtain two passport photos.

Please complete and [print](#) an application form from <https://www.passports.gov.au> prior to attending the Consulate. Alternatively, you can arrive early for your appointment and complete an application form at the Consulate. If you have any other identity documents, please bring these to your appointment.

### **Police report**

If you have not yet obtained a police report, please visit your nearest police station to report your passport as lost or stolen.

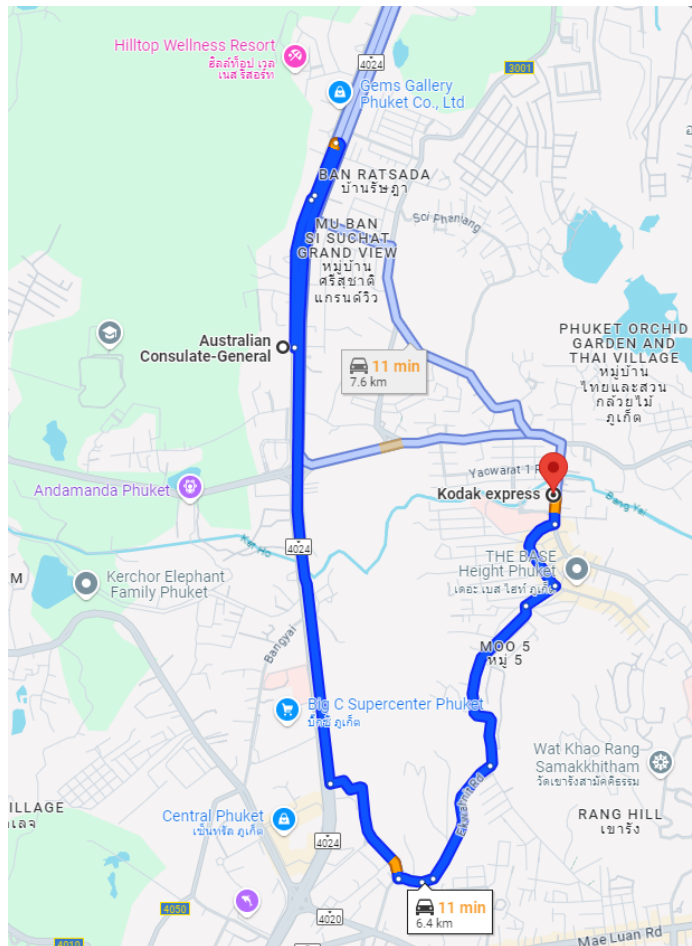
